A. Adaptive Behavior:

• The student demonstrates below-average adaptive behavior in school and at home. A composite score must be at or below the 15th percentile on a nationally-normed, technically adequate measure of adaptive behavior.

AND

- Documentation of needs and levels of support required in at least 4 of the 7 following adaptive behavior domains across multiple
 environments.
 - 1. Daily Living and Independent Living Skills
 - 2. Social and Interpersonal Skills
 - 3. Communication Skills
 - 4. Academic Skills
 - 5. Recreation and Leisure Skills
 - 6. Community Participation Skills
 - 7. Work and Work-Related Skills

AND

Adaptive behavior levels must be supported by a systematic observation and parent input.

B. General Intellectual Functioning

• The student demonstrates significantly below-average general intellectual functioning as measured by an individually administered, nationally normed test of intellectual ability (at least 2 standard deviations below the mean).

AND

• The student's significantly below-average intellectual functioning is verified through a written summary of at least 2 systematic observations, medical and educational history, and one additional source.
